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I. The pornography problem: background

Sexual issues are generally not sexual issues

Sex is a good thing: a reflection of the passion God feels for us

Like any other of God's gifts, it has parameters

II. Facts about pornography

- A high percentage of men and women view pornography online on a regular basis
- 10% to 30% of Web sites are on pornography
- It's a Christian problem, not just a world problem
- It's now a female problem as well as a male one
- There's been a cultural shift even within the church
- It's an exquisitely lonely experience

III. Shame

Shame: an attack on the self by the self

When you don't meet a goal or standard or ideal

An overactive conscience serving as the Law in your heart

The nature of pornography makes it more shameful

There is a sexual taboo

The porn addict's shame may make them non-functional

The cycle

- The acting out
- The relief
- The shame attack
- The Law
- The acting out again

If you get the shame out, the person learns acting out, relief—go get grace

This is why a relational grace person is so important

Relationship, instead of the quick fix—and then the porn loses its power

Where this comes from

There's a normal sexual desire

Normal sexual lust isn't addictive

The answers: - Self-discipline - Self-denial

- Marriage - Sublimation

IV. The deeper needs

- Deep isolation: the inability to make a deep, sustaining, vulnerable relationship
- Lack of freedom
- Lack of structure: inability to control impulses
- Perfectionism
- Anger Opposite-sex conflicts

The hope

Disregard the shame

...Jesus, the source and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that lay before Him endured a cross and despised the shame —Hebrews 12:2

V. Skills

- Become a relational person: be known 100%
- Commit yourself to brutal honesty
- Find the themes that are the inner needs
- Have a process orientation: this is not a quick fix

VI. If you love a struggler

- 1. Realize you're not enough
- 2. Bring in resources
- 3. Educate yourself
- 4. Stay out of the rescuing parent role
- 5. Churches, make sexual issues part of normal discipleship
